THE ACADEMIC PROCESSION

The undergraduate processional begins with a trumpet fanfare as the candidates for degrees march onto the field, school by school. Each group is preceded by a banner bearer and led by the dean and the Founder's Medalist for the school. The candidates enter the field from two points.

PROCESSIONAL I

Entering from the southwest corner of the field is the **College of Arts and Science**, marching in two columns and led by:

Dean Timothy P. McNamara, followed by candidates for the degree of bachelor of arts. Their banner has a white field.

Entering from the southeast corner are **Blair School of Music**, the **School of Engineering**, the **Next Steps** program, and **Peabody College**. They are led by:

Dean Melissa Rose, Blair School of Music, followed by candidates for the degrees of bachelor of music and bachelor of musical arts. Their banner has a pink field.

Dean Krishnendu Roy, School of Engineering, followed by candidates for the degrees of bachelor of engineering and bachelor of science. Their banner has an orange field.

Dean Camilla Benbow, Peabody College, followed by participants in the Next Steps program and candidates for the degree of bachelor of science. The Peabody banner has a light blue field.

PROCESSIONAL II

After the candidates are seated, trumpets will sound a second fanfare and the next procession will enter from the southwest, led by:

Vice Provost for Faculty Affairs and Professional Education Tracey George, followed by the professors emeriti and the faculty.

PROCESSIONAL III

After the faculty have entered, a third trumpet fanfare will sound, and the final procession will enter. The order is:

The graduate and professional degree recipients of the Divinity School, the Graduate School, the Law School, the School of Medicine, the School of Nursing, Owen Graduate School of Management, and Peabody College will celebrate their Commencement in separate ceremonies.

Law School

Dean Chris Guthrie, Law School, is followed by the candidates for the degrees of master of laws and doctor of jurisprudence. Their banner has a purple field.

School of Medicine

Dean Jeffrey R. Balser, School of Medicine, is followed by the candidates for the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of audiology, doctor of medical physics, master of education of the deaf, master of science (speech-language pathology), master of science (applied clinical informatics), master of science in clinical investigation, master of science in medical physics, master of genetic counseling, and master of public health. Their banner has a green field.

Graduate School

Dean André Christie-Mizell, Graduate School, is followed by the candidates for the degrees of master of arts, master of science, master of fine arts, master of liberal arts and science, master of engineering, and doctor of philosophy. The banner for the doctor of philosophy has a dark blue field. The banner for the master of engineering has an orange field.

Divinity School

Dean Yolanda Pierce, Divinity School, is followed by the candidates for the degrees of doctor of ministry, master of divinity, master of theological studies, and master of theology. Their banner has a scarlet field.

Owen Graduate School of Management

Dean Thomas J. Steenburgh, Owen Graduate School of Management, is followed by the candidates for the degrees of master of business administration, master of accountancy, master of science in finance, master of marketing, and master of management in health care. Their banner has a light brown field.

Peabody College (Post-Baccalaureate Graduates)

Dean Camilla Benbow, Peabody College, is followed by the candidates for the degrees of doctor of education, master of education, and master of public policy. Their banner has a light blue field.

School of Nursing

Dean Pamela R. Jeffries, School of Nursing, is followed by the candidates for the degrees of doctor of nursing practice, master of nursing, and master of science in nursing. Their banner has an apricot field.

The Symbols and Regalia

The visual symbols of Vanderbilt University communicate our rich history and our vibrant future. The oak laurels are a traditional symbol for education as well as for strength and longevity and were inspired by motifs from the Vanderbilt family coat of arms. The initial gold “V” takes center prominence, signifying what is rare and lasting, its beveled appearance simulating the permanence of stone carving. The rays of the North Star and notches around the edge evoke the nautical compass, a reminder of Commodore Cornelius Vanderbilt’s background, but also a symbol of the mission of the university as a community that helps to guide lifelong potential through self-direction. Vanderbilt’s motto in the encircling banner is *Crescere aude*, Latin for “dare to grow.” It embodies the sentiment expressed in Vanderbilt’s alma mater, “Forward! ever be thy watchword.”

The current chair of the Faculty Senate, or the vice chair if the chair is unavailable, carries the mace, an ancient sign of authority. It is displayed on the front of the podium as the symbol of the university’s authority to confer degrees. Symbolic images that decorate the gilded metal of the mace include VU monograms, embattled shields, oak leaves and acorns, irises and magnolias.

The chancellor’s insignia of office is a silver and gilt collar that displays several emblems of the university. The parallel chains of sterling silver are surmounted by alternating Vanderbilt shields and modified Founder’s Medals, from which hangs a medallion with an impression of the seal of the university. The decagonal silver frame of the medallion symbolizes the ten schools. Trustees of the university wear black gowns distinguished by gold piping and gold velvet bars on the sleeves and the university seal on the chest panel of the gowns.

The design of the academic regalia and the colors worn are significant. Undergraduates—those receiving bachelor’s degrees—wear tassels signifying the degree they have earned: golden yellow for science, pink for music, and orange for engineering. By tradition, the bachelor of arts degree tassels are black. The distinguishing mark of the gown is the sleeve: bachelor—a long, pointed sleeve; master—an oblong sleeve open at the wrist; doctor—bell-shaped sleeve with three velvet bars. Vanderbilt candidates for the doctor of philosophy wear eight-sided velvet tams with gold tassels and a custom gown with antique gold front and back panels and an embroidered “V” on the front. Candidates for a doctoral degree other than the doctor of philosophy wear black gowns and six-sided tams.

The velvet edging of the doctoral hoods signifies whether the degree is J.D., M.D., Ed.D., D.N.P., D.Min., or Ph.D.—purple for law, green for medicine, light blue for education, apricot for nursing, scarlet for ministry, and dark blue for the doctor of philosophy, which may be earned in a number of disciplines.

Masters’ hoods are edged with white for arts, brown for fine arts, gold for science, purple for law, salmon pink for public health, peacock blue for public policy, scarlet for theology, light blue for education, orange for engineering, apricot for nursing, and light brown for business. All hoods are lined with silk in colors signifying the institution granting the degree. Vanderbilt hoods are lined in gold and bear a black chevron.

THE Nichols- Chancellor's MEDAL

The Nichols-Chancellor's Medal is one of the university's highest honors and is awarded to individuals who define the 21st century and exemplify the best qualities of the human spirit. It was established by Vanderbilt Law School graduate Edward C. Nichols, Jr., and his wife, Janice, in memory of Edward Carmack Nichols and Lucile Hamby Nichols.

The 2025 Nichols-Chancellor's Medal is presented to humanitarian, actor, and musician Gary Sinise. Sinise grew up in a family of veterans, and his role as Lt. Dan Taylor in the Academy Award-winning film *Forrest Gump* strengthened his connection with the military community. Sinise's portrayal of a Vietnam veteran who lost his legs in combat created an enduring relationship with veterans and service members alike, especially wounded service members. It was after 9/11 that Sinise's commitment became even stronger, and he was propelled to a life of service and advocacy for America's veterans and defenders. He formed the Lt. Dan Band in 2003 to perform for our troops at home and overseas through charities and nonprofits such as the United Service Organizations. In 2011 he founded the Gary Sinise Foundation, to expand upon his efforts. Since its founding, the Gary Sinise Foundation has served thousands of veterans, defenders, first responders, and families of our fallen heroes through unique programming designed to uplift, inspire, and build communities.

Sinise received the Presidential Citizens Medal, among many other service and humanitarian awards. For his accomplishments in film, television, and theater, he won an Emmy, a Golden Globe, and a Tony, was nominated for an Academy Award, and in 2017 received a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame.

THE FOUNDER'S MEDAL RECIPIENTS

Nikki Takahashi Weitzenhoffer, from Norman, Oklahoma, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the College of Arts and Science. She is graduating with a bachelor of arts.

Nikki majored in history of art, minored in history, and earned highest honors for her honors thesis. The project focused on Ukiyo-e, a Japanese art form during the 17th through 19th centuries depicting scenes from everyday life on woodblock prints and paintings. She learned how historical research can illuminate broader cultural questions, which inspired her to pursue a master's at Vanderbilt in history of art. Her leadership roles—including co-president of the History of Art Society and co-assistant director of the Research on Conflict and Collective Action Lab—strengthened her commitment to use research as a tool for advocacy. She also was an undergraduate research assistant for the lab, a senior staff editor for *Vanderbilt Historical Review*, group leader for Volunteers for Health, and a Buchanan Library Fellow. Nikki is grateful for the transformative guidance of Helmut Smith in history and Susan Dine in history of art and architecture, professors who shaped her academic journey, future aspirations, and growth. After earning her master's, Nikki plans to go to law school and develop expertise in art and cultural heritage restitution law.

Charles Thomas Schmitt, from Maitland, Florida, is this year's Founder's Medalist for Blair School of Music. He is graduating with a bachelor of music.

Charlie is the third of three children in his family to earn a Vanderbilt degree. He majored in trumpet performance with a concentration in jazz studies, was inducted into the Pi Kappa Lambda Music Honor Society in 2024 and received Blair's Spirit of Billy Adair Award for service and leadership. An academic highlight was doing research with the Yusef A. Lateef Collection as a Buchanan Library Fellow. As a member of Blair's jazz ensembles, he has played at some of Nashville's foremost music venues, and he traveled to Cuba, Colombia and the Dominican Republic with the Vanderbilt Wind Symphony. He was a semifinalist in the National Trumpet Competition's solo jazz division and was recognized by *Downbeat* magazine for his Blair performances. Charlie thanks God and the help of his professors, especially Jose Sibaja and Jeff Coffin, for showing him that striving to become a better person is an essential part of being a lifelong musician. After graduation, Charlie will attend the University of Miami's Frost School of Music to pursue a master of music in jazz instrumental performance.

Grace Ann Jones, from Knoxville, Tennessee, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Engineering. She is graduating with a bachelor of science.

Grace was the first in her family to attend a university in the United States, an Ingram Scholar, and a finalist for Class of 2025 Outstanding Senior in recognition of her leadership, service, and passion. Her inspiration to major in engineering was the Nanoscale Innovation and Making course at the Wond'ry, where her team worked on a prototype sensor to monitor food expiration to help reduce food waste. She also majored in chemistry and math, with minors in scientific computing and business. During her internship with SkyNano, she worked to develop ways to convert atmospheric CO₂ into valuable carbon nanotubes. She was co-president of Next Steps Ambassadors, founded the Vanderbilt Gymnastics Club, was president of Vanderbilt's American Chemical Society chapter, and supported programs for at-risk youth as a volunteer at Preston Taylor Ministries in Nashville. Grace studied abroad in Cameroon, and she did community development work in Bolivia for her Ingram summer project, which she continued through a Nichols Humanitarian Fund award the next year. Looking to the future, Grace will pursue a fellowship exploring technological innovation startups for social impact.

Samuel Elliott Lu, from Little Rock, Arkansas, is this year's Founder's Medalist for Peabody College. He is graduating with a bachelor of science.

Samuel continues the legacy of teachers in his family, including two great-grandparents, both grandmothers and an aunt. They include teachers who taught in their native Taiwan and who taught at Little Rock Central High School during the time of the Little Rock Nine, students who broke the color barrier in 1957. Vanderbilt professors describe Samuel as earnest, inquisitive, hardworking, open-minded and deeply curious about content and pedagogy. He excelled in his courses and completed a triple major in early childhood and elementary education, human and organizational development, and climate studies. During his internship at Our House Shelter in Central Arkansas, which serves families and youth experiencing homelessness, he worked alongside a talented classroom teacher to support students' summer learning and foster a love for literature. He also founded Camp P.L.A.Y., a play-based education program supported by the Nichols Humanitarian Fund. True to his humble and generous spirit, he credits his cohort with having the greatest influence on his experiences at Peabody. After graduation, Samuel will be an elementary school teacher in Raleigh, North Carolina.

Thornton Taylor Muncher, from Sumiton, Alabama, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Divinity School. He is graduating with a master of divinity.

Thornton earned a bachelor's degree in literature, religion, and myth from Birmingham-Southern College and at Vanderbilt was awarded a Carpenter Scholarship and a Blakemore-West End UMC Scholarship. His academic interests include Jewish studies, Mediterranean and Near Eastern studies, and global Christianities and interreligious encounter. He was a teaching assistant in the Department of Classical and Mediterranean Studies, served on the Divinity School Honor Council, and presented at meetings of the Society of Biblical Literature, the American Academy of Religion–Southeast Region, and Belmont University. Participating in the Fellowships at Auschwitz for the Study of Professional Ethics program had a profound impact on him, as he and other graduate students and future leaders explored ethical responsibilities in their own fields by analyzing the decisions and actions of professionals during the Holocaust. After graduation, Thornton will be a program coordinator in the Jack, Joseph and Morton Mandel Center for Advanced Holocaust Studies at the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum. He also is pursuing ordination in the United Methodist Church.

Robert Davis Rickard, from Austin, Texas, is this year's Founder's Medalist for Owen Graduate School of Management. He is graduating with a master of business administration.

Robert earned a bachelor of business administration with a major in finance at Texas Tech University, where he also played on scholarship for the golf team. At Vanderbilt, his MBA concentrations were finance, operations and analytics, and strategy. He was honored as a Dean's Scholar, a Bruce D. Henderson Scholar, and an E. Bronson Ingram Scholar. Two influential courses for him were Corporate Financial Policy with Professor Josh White and Corporate Strategy with Professor Brian McCann, which reinforced his interest in consulting and in tackling complex, high-impact business challenges. Before coming to Vanderbilt, Vicky earned a bachelor of arts at the University of Miami and a master of science at Mississippi College. At Vanderbilt, she received the DAISY Award recognizing extraordinary nurses and nursing students and was selected for a federal Health Resources and Services Administration-funded grant that provided nurse practitioner clinical experience in rural and underserved health clinics in Kentucky. She also was part of a team providing vaccinations and health screening assessments with the Vanderbilt Mobile Vaccine Clinic and began fostering relationships with communities she plans to serve.
